- John gave the Board a DeGallagherizing handout to read.
- John requested a capital outlay fund of \$9,000 for hydrants that Indian Shadows is getting rid of, for use in part with the new tanks. He wanted to take advantage of the greatly reduced price for "new" hydrants. Paul motioned for approval. Brent seconded the motion. It passed.
- EMT training has been ongoing.
- 19 members took advantage of Wildland training. Six Red Cards were issued.

- The July Picnic is scheduled for 21st from 12 3pm at the Old Fort Lewis.
- The Los Pinos truck now is: B-75 (033).
- Paul suggested a breaker vs. a fuse to fix power challenges experienced in the Medic units.
- John said they are still working on JR Fire Fighters Protocol.
